NEW SECTION

WAC 220-310-18500R Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Cowlitz River. Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-185, effective April 1, 2015, until further notice, in the waters of the Cowlitz River from boundary markers at the mouth upstream to 400 feet or posted markers below the Cowlitz Salmon Hatchery barrier dam, a daily limit of three hatchery steelhead applies.

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- (x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- () That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- () That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012 or 2013, which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

Reasons for this finding: There has been a strong showing of hatchery late winter run steelhead on the Cowlitz River. Increasing the steelhead daily limit will provide additional angling opportunity. The hatchery brood stock goal is expected to be met. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.
