NEW SECTION

WAC 220-56-35000E Clams other than razor clams – Areas and seasons.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-56-350, effective immediately until further notice, it is unlawful to take, dig for and possess clams, cockles, and mussels taken for personal use from the following public tidelands except during the open periods specified herein:

North Bay: State-owned oyster reserves are open May 1 through May 31, 2015.

NEW SECTION

WAC 220-56-38000J Oysters – Areas and seasons.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-56-380, effective immediately until further notice, it is unlawful to take and possess oysters taken for personal use from the following public tidelands, except during the open periods specified herein:

North Bay: State-owned oyster reserves are open May 1 through May 31, 2015.

REPEALERS

The following sections of the Washington Administrative Code are repealed effective June 1, 2015:

WAC 220-56-35000E Clams other than razor clams—Areas and seasons. WAC 220-56-38000J Oysters—Areas and seasons.

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- (x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- () That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- () That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012 or 2013 which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

Reasons for this finding: The Oyster Reserves of North Bay (Case Inlet) are subject to a Settlement Agreement before the State Shoreline Hearings Board (SHB No. 13-022) that limits the clam season on the beach to the months of May and September for 2015 and 2016. The oyster seasons on these beaches coincide with the clam seasons. These rules are interim until permanent rules take effect.
