NEW SECTION

WAC 220-310-20000H Exceptions to statewide rules—Columbia River.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-200:

- (1) Effective June 16 through August 15, 2015:
 - (a) It is permissible to fish for salmon in waters of the Columbia River from the Highway 395 Bridge at Pasco to the Interstate 182 Bridge in Richland.
 - (b) Daily limit of three salmon, of which no more than one may be adult hatchery chinook and no more than two may be sockeye. Release wild adult Chinook.
- (2) Effective June 16 through August 15, 2015:
 - (a) It is permissible to fish for salmon in waters of the Columbia River from the Interstate 182 Bridge in Richland to Priest Rapids Dam.
 - (b) Daily limit of eight salmon, of which no more than two may be adult hatchery chinook and no more than six may be sockeye. Release wild adult Chinook.

REPEALER

The following section of the Washington Administrative Code is repealed effective August 16, 2015:

WAC 220-310-20000H Exceptions to statewide rules—Columbia River.

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- (x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- () That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- () That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012 or 2013, which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

Reasons for this finding: Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) is creating a new salmon fishery management area near the mouth of the Yakima River to manage fishing effort, harvest and provide protective daily limits in this short, six-mile river section. This is being done because of the on-going reintroduction of summer Chinook and sockeye into the Yakima Basin by the Yakama Nation, with WDFW's cooperation. The Department is in the process of adopting permanent rules that are necessary to implement this fishery and this rule is interim until permanent rules take effect.
