This closure is needed to protect wild Chinook. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.

#### ORDER NO. 15-180

#### NEW SECTION

### WAC 220-310-18000R Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Coastal

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-180, it is unlawful to violate the following provisions, provided that unless otherwise amended, all permanent rules remain in effect:

**Sol Duc River (Clallam County)** Effective June 18, 2015, until further notice it is unlawful to fish in those waters of the Sol Duc River from 200 feet below the Sol Duc Hatchery outfall creek upstream to the concrete pump station at Sol Duc Hatchery.

#### **EMERGENCY RULE ONLY**

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- (x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- () That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- () That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years 2009, 2010, or 2011, which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

**Reasons for this finding**: Low water is causing a delay in migration past the hatchery, resulting in greater vulnerability of the wild spring/summer Chinook to fishing pressure. This is likely to remain a problem until stream flows increase in the fall. The Quileute Tribe is implementing a similar closure to subsistence fishing in the vicinity of the hatchery. These closures are needed to protect wild Chinook. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.
