WAC 220-310-18500B Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Southwest.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-185, effective July 1 through July 31, 2015, in the waters of the Cowlitz River from the mouth upstream to the Lexington Drive Bridge (Sparks Road Bridge) barbless hooks are required while angling for hatchery salmon and hatchery trout.
