EMERGENCY RULE

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal year 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, or 2013, which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

Reasons for this finding: Preliminary estimates indicate that landed catch of Chinook will exceed the preseason expectations in Marine Area 9. The Chinook fishery is closing to control impacts on stocks of concern and ensure compliance with conservation objectives and agreed-to management plans. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.

NEW SECTION

WAC 232-28-62100P Puget Sound salmon—saltwater seasons and daily limits.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 232-28-621, effective July 27 through August 15, 2015, it is unlawful to violate the provisions below. Unless otherwise amended, all permanent rules remain in effect:

Catch Record Card Area 9:

- (1) Daily limit of 2 salmon plus 2 additional pink. Release Chinook and chum.
- (2) South of a line from Foulweather Bluff to Olele Point: Open. Daily limit 2 salmon plus 2 additional pink. Release Chinook and chum.
- (3) Edmonds Public Fishing Pier: Daily limit of 2 salmon plus 2 additional pink. No more than 1 may be a Chinook. Release chum August 1 through August 15.

REPEALER

The following section of the Washington Administrative Code is repealed effective August 16, 2015:

WAC 232-28-62100P Puget Sound salmon—saltwater seasons and daily limits.

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

(x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.

() That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.

() That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years , 2011, 2012 or 2013 which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

Reasons for this finding: Preliminary estimates indicate that landed catch of Chinook in 9 will exceed the preseason expectations without modification to the fishery. The Chinook fishery is being closed to control impacts on stocks of concern and ensure compliance with conservation objectives and agreed-to management plans. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.
