WAC 220-310-18000X Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Coastal.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-180, effective August 12, 2015, until further notice, it is unlawful to fish in the waters of Black River from the mouth upstream to Black Lake.

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY
