NEW SECTION

WAC 220-56-33000T Crab – Areas and Seasons

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-56-330, effective immediately until further notice:

- (1) It is unlawful to fish for Dungeness crab in Marine Area 1 adjacent to Washington and that portion of Marine Area 2 south of Point Chehalis (46⁰53.18), including Marine Area 2-1 Willapa Bay and the Columbia River.
- (2) It is unlawful to set, maintain, operate, or possess in those waters listed in subsections (1) of this section, any baited or unbaited shellfish pots or ring nets for any reason.

REPEALER

The following section of the Washington Administrative Code is repealed:

WAC 220-56-33000S Crab—Areas and Seasons. (15-239)

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

Reasons for this finding: Test results from the Washington Department of Health show that crab tested in the area between Point Chehalis and the US/Canada border are safe for human consumption. Levels of domoic acid, detected through routine testing are below the federally established action level. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules. **(15-294, 8/28/2015)**
