NEW SECTION

WAC 220-310-19500K Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Eastside.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-195, effective immediately until further notice, currently open fisheries for game fish in the Yakima River basin are modified as follows:

- (1) Ahtanum Creek, including North and Middle Forks: Closed
- (2) Little Naches River: Closed
- (3) Teanaway River, including West, Middle and North Forks: Closed
- (4) Swauk Creek and all tributaries downstream of Williams Creek: Closed from 2:00 p.m. until 12:00 midnight
- (5) Williams Creek and all tributaries: Closed
- (6) Swauk Creek and all tributaries upstream of Williams Creek: Closed
- (7) American River from: a) mouth to Hwy. 410 Bridge downstream of the USFS Hell's Crossing Campground (river mile 5.4), and b) upstream of the Mesatchee Creek Trail crossing at river mile 15.8: Closed

REPEALER

The following section of the Washington Administrative Code is repealed:

WAC 220-310-19500G Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Eastside. (15-251)

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

(x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.

() That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.

() That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012 or 2013 which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

Reasons for this finding: Cooler weather and recent precipitation in the Cascades have reduced mid-to-late afternoon water temperature below the 65 degree threshold used to justify hoot owl drought restrictions adopted in mid-July in the Naches Basin and mid-August on the upper Yakima River. Lifting these restrictions will provide angling opportunity. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules. (15-300, 9/2/2015)
