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NEW SECTION

WAC 220-310-18500E Southwest – Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-185, effective November 1, 2015, until further notice it is unlawful to violate the following provisions, provided that unless otherwise amended, all permanent rules remain in effect:

- (1) The following restrictions apply during the open times in the waters listed in this section:
- (a) Daily limit is 6 fish of which no more than 2 may be adults of which no more than 1 may be a hatchery adult coho.
 - (b) Release all salmon other than hatchery Chinook and hatchery coho.
 - (c) Wild Chinook may be retained in Deep River and the Lewis River (including North Fork).
- (2) Deep River
- (3) Grays River including West Fork
- (4) Elochoman River
- (5) Cowlitz River
- (6) Toutle River including North Fork
- (7) Green River (Cowlitz County)
- (8) Tilton River
- (9) Mayfield Lake (Reservoir)
- (10) Cispus River
- (11) Lake Scanewa (Cowlitz Falls Reservoir)
- (12) Kalama River
- (13) Lewis River including North Fork
- (14) Washougal River

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- (x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- () That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- () That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012 or 2013 which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

Reasons for this finding: Lower Columbia adult coho hatchery returns are behind schedule and brood stock and re-introduction goals may not be met. A conservative daily limit of one hatchery adult has been implemented in an effort to help achieve those goals. (15-404, 10/28/2015)
