WAC 232-28-62000U Coastal salmon—saltwater seasons.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 232-28-620, effective October 30, 2015, until further notice, Marine Area 2.2 and all tributaries is closed to fishing.

NEW SECTION

WAC 220-310-18000E Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Coastal.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-180, effective October 30, 2015, until further notice, the following waters are closed to fishing:

- (1) Black River (Grays Harbor/Thurston Co.) Including all tributaries.
- (2) Chehalis River (Grays Harbor/Thurston/Lewis Co.) Including all tributaries.
- (3) Elk River (Grays Harbor Co.) Including all tributaries.
- (4) Hoquiam River (Grays Harbor Co.) Including all tributaries.
- (5) Humptulips River (Grays Harbor Co.) Including all tributaries.
- (6) Johns River (Grays Harbor Co.) Including all tributaries.
- (7) Newaukum River (Lewis Co.) Including all tributaries.
- (8) Satsop River (Mason/Grays Harbor Co.) Including all tributaries.
- (9) Skookumchuck River (Lewis/Thurston Co.) Including all tributaries.
- (10) Wishkah River (Grays Harbor Co.) Including all tributaries.
- (11) Wynoochee River (Grays Harbor/Jefferson Co.) Including all tributaries.

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- (x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- () That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- () That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012 or 2013 which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

Reasons for this finding: This emergency closure is needed as in-season run size assessments conducted by Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife indicate that coho run sizes are significantly below pre-season forecasts. Conservation objectives may not be achieved for coho if this action is not taken. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.
