NEW SECTION

WAC 220-310-19000S Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Puget Sound. Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-190:

- (1) Effective immediately through January 31, 2016, it is permissible to fish in the waters of the Green/Duwamish River, from the mouth of Cristy Creek (at Flaming Geyser State Park) to the water pipeline walk bridge (1/2 mile downstream of Tacoma Headworks Dam).
- (a) Trout Daily limit of two; minimum size 14 inches,
- (b) Other game fish statewide minimum size/daily limits apply.
- (2) Green River (King Co.): From the mouth of the Green River upstream to the mouth of Cristy Creek (at Flaming Geyser State Park): Daily limit 3 adult salmon, release Chinook and coho.

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- (x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- () That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- () That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years, 2011, 2012 or 2013 which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

Reasons for this finding: The upper section of the Green River had been closed to protect spawning Chinook and Coho salmon. With the return of Chinook and Coho salmon to the Green River considered complete, this regulation re-opens the upper area for retention of winter hatchery steelhead through January 31, 2016. There is insufficient time to promulgate permanent rules. (15-437, 12/2/2015)
