NEW SECTION

WAC 220-310-19500Y Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Eastside.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-195, effective April 11 through April 15, 2016, it is unlawful to fish in waters of Rainbow Lake.

REPEALER

The following section of the Washington Administrative Code is repealed effective April 16, 2016:

WAC 220-310-19500Y Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Eastside.

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- (x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- () That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- () That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012 or 2013, which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

Reasons for this finding: For safety of the general public and equipment operators an emergency rule is needed to close Rainbow Lake for five days as large equipment will be utilized around Rainbow Lake to dig test pits and take core samples for planned construction of the lake as part of the W.T. Wooten Floodplain Management Plan. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules
