NEW SECTION

WAC 220-310-19500Z Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Eastside.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-195, effective April 7 through April 27, 2016, it is unlawful to fish in the waters of Easton Ponds 1 and 2 (Kittitas Co.).

REPEALER

The following section of the Washington Administrative Code is repealed effective April 28, 2016:

WAC 220-310-19500Z Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Eastside.

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- (x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- () That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- () That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012 or 2013, which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

Reasons for this finding: The Yakima/Klickitat Fisheries Project managers (Yakama Nation and WDFW) are using the two main gravel pit ponds at Easton to acclimate and release hatchery-reared coho smolts this spring. The temporary closure of the hatchery rainbow trout fishery and delay of stocking is necessary during the smolt acclimation period. Both ponds will be stocked with catchable trout after the majority of the coho salmon have migrated. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.
