NEW SECTION

WAC 220-310-20000I Exceptions to statewide rules—Columbia River sturgeon. Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-200:

- (1) June 18 and July 1, 2016, it is permissible to retain white sturgeon between 38-inches minimum and 54-inches maximum fork length caught in those waters of the Columbia River and tributaries from Bonneville Dam upstream to sturgeon spawning Sanctuary boundary located 1.8 miles downstream of The Dalles Dam.
- (2) Effective immediately until further notice, except for the specific dates described in subsection (1) of this section, it is unlawful to retain sturgeon caught in those waters of the Columbia River and tributaries from Bonneville Dam upstream to The Dalles Dam. Catch and release is permissible except from May 1 through July 31, 2016 in the sturgeon spawning Sanctuary located from The Dalles Dam downstream 1.8 miles.
- (3) Effective April 30, 2016, until further notice, it is unlawful to retain white sturgeon caught in those waters of the Columbia River and in all adjacent Washington tributaries from The Dalles Dam upstream to John Day Dam. Catch and release is permissible except from May 1 through July 31, 2016 in the sturgeon spawning Sanctuary located from John Day Dam downstream 2.4 miles.

REPEALER

The following section of the Washington Administrative Code is repealed:

WAC 220-310-20000H Exceptions to statewide rules—Columbia River sturgeon. (16-71)

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- (x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- () That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- () That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012 or 2013 which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

Reasons for this finding: Closes The Dalles Pool and adjacent tributaries for the retention of white sturgeon. The harvest guideline of 100 fish is expected to be reached. The summer-period white sturgeon retention season in Bonneville Reservoir remains in place. Catch and release is allowed during non-retention periods, except within the May-July sturgeon spawning sanctuaries. This emergency rule is consistent with the Joint Washington-Oregon Action of April 27 2016 and conforms Washington state rules with Oregon state rules. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules. (16-87, 4/27/2016)
