ORDER NO. 16-104

NEW SECTION

WAC 220-310-19500H Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Eastside.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-195, effective May 16, 2016, until further notice it is permissible to fish in waters of the Icicle River from the closure signs located 800 feet upstream of the mouth to 500 feet downstream of the Leavenworth National Fish Hatchery Barrier Dam. Also, it is permissible to fish from the closure signs located upstream of the Leavenworth National Fish Hatchery where Cyo Road would intersect the Icicle River at the Sleeping Lady Resort (RM 4.0) to the Icicle Peshastin Irrigation District footbridge 750' upstream of the Snow Lakes trailhead parking area (RM 5.7)

- (1) Daily limit two hatchery Chinook, minimum size 12 inches.
- (2) Mandatory retention of hatchery spring Chinook.
- (3) Anglers must release adipose present Chinook unharmed and cannot be removed from the water prior to release.
- (4) Anglers must release all Chinook with one or more round ¼ inch diameter holes punched in the caudal (tail) fin.
 - (5) No gear restrictions. Night closure is in effect.

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

- (x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
