NEW SECTION

WAC 220-310-19000G Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Puget Sound.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-190, effective immediately the following waters are closed to fishing:

- (1) Lake Washington (King Co.)
- (a) Effective June 4, 2016, from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. it is permissible for youth anglers participating in the CAST for Kids Fishing event to fish in the nets pens in Lake Washington at Gene Coulon Memorial Beach Park.
- (b) Effective June 4, 2016, from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. it is permissible for youth anglers participating in the Northshore Chapter Trout Unlimited Kids Fishing event to fish in the net pens in Lake Washington at Tracy Owen Station at Log Boom Park.
- (2) Lake Union (King Co.)
- (3) Lake Sammamish (King Co.)
- (4) Monte Cristo Lake (Snohomish Co.)
- (5) Cushman Lake (Mason Co.)
- (6) Barney Lake (Skagit Co.)

The following section of the Washington Administrative Code is repealed:

WAC 220-310-19000E Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Puget Sound (16-95)

Reasons for this finding: An emergency rule is needed to reopen two portions of Lake Washington which were previously closed by WSR 16-10-068 which was needed as Endangered Species Act (ESA) coverage for Chinook and steelhead impacts expired April 30, 2016. This emergency rule will allow for two fishing events that will offer youths an opportunity to participate and learn about fishing who would otherwise not get the chance.
