NEW SECTION

WAC 220-310-19500R Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Lake Wenatchee.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-195, effective July 20, 2016, one hour before official sunrise, until further notice, it is permissible to fish for sockeye salmon in Lake Wenatchee:

- (1) Daily limit 6 sockeye, minimum size 12 inches in length.
- (2) Selective gear rules and night closure in effect for all species.
- (3) Anglers may fish with 2 poles so long as they possess a valid two-pole endorsement.
- (4) Bull trout, steelhead, and Chinook salmon must be released unharmed without removing the fish from the water.

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- (x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- () That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- () That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012 or 2013 which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

Reasons for this finding: Based on current sockeye passage analysis at both Tumwater Dam and mainstem Columbia River Dams, at least 60,000 total sockeye are projected to be destined for Lake Wenatchee. This provides an estimated 37,000 sockeye to be available for harvest above the natural spawning escapement goal of 23,000 fish. Opening Lake Wenatchee for a sockeye fishery will provide angling opportunity. (16-183, 7/18/2016)
