# WAC 220-310-18000Y Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Coastal.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-180, effective immediately through January 2, 2017, it is permissible to fish in waters of South Pond at the Bogachiel Hatchery:

- (1) Open days per week.
- (2) Statewide rules apply with a daily limit of 5 trout.

## REPEALERS

The following section of the Washington Administrative Code is repealed:

WAC 220-310-18000W Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Coastal. (16-112)

The following section of the Washington Administrative Code is repealed effective January 3, 2016:

WAC 220-310-18000Y Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Coastal.

### EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- (x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- () That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- () That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012 or 2013, which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

**Reasons for this finding**: South Pond is continuing to see fishing activity, and catchable numbers of trout are present in the pond. The pond was initially opened to trout fishing because of recent restrictions to general public access to Wentworth Lake, where hatchery trout were normally planted. This emergency rule is needed to extend the fishery which will provide additional angling opportunity. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.
