NEW SECTION

WAC 220-312-05000G Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Snake River. Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-312-050 and WAC 220-313-010:

- (1) Effective April 28, 2017, until further notice, a person may fish for and possess salmon in waters of the Snake River from the South Bound Highway 12 Bridge at Pasco upstream about 7 miles to the fishing restriction boundary below Ice Harbor Dam. Open Friday and Saturday each week. Daily limit of six hatchery Chinook, of which not more than one may be an adult Chinook. Minimum size for Chinook is 12 inches in length.
- (a) All Chinook with the adipose fin intact, and all steelhead, must be released immediately, unharmed.
- (b) Hooks must be barbless when fishing for all species during times and in locations open for salmon fishing and retention, and only single barbless hooks are allowed when fishing for sturgeon.
- (c) It is unlawful to use any hook larger than 5/8-inch (point of hook to shank) for all species except sturgeon.
- (d) Night closure is in effect for salmon and sturgeon.
- (e) For all areas open for Chinook, anglers must cease fishing for Chinook when the adult limit has been retained for the day.
- (f) Anglers may possess 1 daily limit in fresh form in addition to the 2 daily limits in fresh form allowed by permanent rule.
- (2) Effective April 30, 2017, until further notice, a person may fish for and possess salmon in the following waters of the Snake River from Texas Rapids boat launch (south side of the river approximately 3.5 miles upstream of the mouth of Tucannon River) to the fishing restriction boundary below Little Goose Dam. Minimum size for Chinook is 12 inches in length. This zone includes the area between the juvenile bypass return pipe and Little Goose Dam along the south shoreline of the facility (includes the walkway area locally known as "the wall" in front of the juvenile collection facility). Open Sunday and Monday each week. Daily limit of six hatchery Chinook, of which not more than one may be an adult Chinook.
- (a) All Chinook with the adipose fin intact, and all steelhead, must be released immediately, unharmed.
- (b) Hooks must be barbless when fishing for all species during times and in locations open for salmon fishing and retention, and only single barbless hooks are allowed when fishing for sturgeon.
- (c) It is unlawful to use any hook larger than 5/8-inch (point of hook to shank) for all species except sturgeon.
- (d) Night closure is in effect for salmon and sturgeon.
- (e) For all areas open for Chinook, anglers must cease fishing for Chinook when the adult limit has been retained for the day.
- (f) Anglers may possess 1 daily limit in fresh form in addition to the 2 daily limits in fresh form allowed by permanent rule.

(3) Effective April 30, 2017, until further notice, a person may fish for and possess salmon in the following waters of the Snake River from the downstream edge of the large power lines crossing the Snake River (just upstream from the West Evans Road on the south shore) upstream about 3.5 miles to the Washington state line (from the east levee of the

Greenbelt boat launch in Clarkston northwest across the Snake River to the WA/ID boundary waters marker on the Whitman County shore). Open Sunday and Monday each week. Daily limit of six hatchery Chinook, of which not more than one may be an adult Chinook. Minimum size for Chinook is 12 inches in length.

- (a) All Chinook with the adipose fin intact, and all steelhead, must be released immediately, unharmed.
- (b) Hooks must be barbless when fishing for all species during times and in locations open for salmon fishing and retention, and only single barbless hooks are allowed when fishing for sturgeon.
- (c) It is unlawful to use any hook larger than 5/8-inch (point of hook to shank) for all species except sturgeon.
- (d) Night closure is in effect for salmon and sturgeon.
- (e) For all areas open for Chinook, anglers must cease fishing for Chinook when the adult limit has been retained for the day.
- (f) Anglers may possess 1 daily limit in fresh form in addition to the 2 daily limits in fresh form allowed by permanent rule.
