### NEW SECTION

### WAC 220-312-03000C Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Southwest.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-312-030, effective June 1 until July 31, 2017, it is permissible to fish for salmon in those waters of the Lewis River from the mouth upstream to the overhead powerlines below Merwin Dam. Daily limit 6 hatchery Chinook of which only 1 may be an adult. Minimum size 12 inches.
