WAC 220-314-03000I Halibut—Seasons—Daily and possession limits.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-314-030, 220-314-040, and 220-314-010, effective 11:59 p.m. June 23, 2017, until further notice, it is unlawful to fish for or possess halibut taken for personal use in Catch Record Areas 1 through 13.

REPEALER
