WAC 220-312-04000J Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Puget Sound.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-312-040, effective immediately through July 15, 2017, it is permissible to fish for sockeye salmon in those waters of the Skagit River from the Hwy. 536 at Mt. Vernon (Memorial Hwy. Bridge) to mouth of Gilligan Creek.

- (1) Closed on June 29, 30, July 5, and 11, 2017, from the mouth to the Highway 530 Bridge at Rockport.
- (2) Daily limit of three sockeye salmon.
- (3) Night closure is in effect.
