NEW SECTION

WAC 220-312-04000T Exceptions to statewide rules -- Carbon River.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-312-040, effective September 1, through November 30, 2017, it is unlawful to violate the provisions below. Unless otherwise amended, all permanent rules remain in effect:

(1) Carbon River (Pierce County):

- (a) From mouth to Voight Creek:
 - (i) Barbless hooks required September 1 through November 30, 2017.
 - (ii) Salmon:
 - (A) Open September 1, 2017 through November 30, 2017
 - (B) Daily limit 6. Up to 4 adult salmon may be retained of which up to 2 may be hatchery Chinook salmon. Release chum and wild adult Chinook.
