Reasons for this finding: Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife and tribal co-managers agreed to a limited							
number of Chinook encounters retaining or releasing fish that anglers are allowed in Marine Areas 8-1 through 10.							
Preliminary estimates indicate that there is a high risk of reaching the allowable limit of total Chinook encounters prior to the scheduled end of the season due to high sublegal encounters. This emergency rule is needed to modify these fisheries to stay within the agreed to number of encounters and increasing the possibility of providing season-long fisheries which will provide additional angling opportunity. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent							
rules.

## NEW SECTION

WAC 220-313-06000J Puget Sound salmon—saltwater seasons and daily limits. Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-313-060, effective November 13, 2017, until further notice, it is unlawful to violate the provisions below. Unless otherwise amended, all permanent rules remain in effect.

(1) Marine Areas 8-1, 8-2 and 9, excluding Edmonds Public Fishing Pier: Closed to salmon angling.
