WAC 220-313-06000L Puget Sound salmon—saltwater seasons and daily limits.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-313-060, effective March 30 through April 15, 2018, it is unlawful to violate the provisions below. Unless otherwise amended, all permanent rules remain in effect.

(1) Marine Catch Record Card Area 9; excluding Edmonds Public Fishing Pier:

- (a) Salmon:
- (i) Daily limit 2.
- (ii) Chinook minimum length 22 inches.
- (iii) Release coho and wild Chinook.
