EMERGENCY RULE

Reasons for this finding: This emergency rule is needed because the Department of Fish and Wildlife is in the process of adopting permanent rules that are necessary to implement the personal use fishing plans agreed-to with resource co-managers at the North of Falcon proceedings. This emergency rule is necessary to comply with agreed-to management plans, and is interim until permanent rules take effect. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.

NEW SECTION

WAC 220-312-04000I Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Puget Sound.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-312-04000E and WAC 220-312-040, effective June 16, 2018:

Skagit River, from the Highway 536 Bridge at Mt. Vernon to the mouth of Gilligan Creek:

(a) Salmon open June 16 through July 15, 2018:

- (i) Daily limit 3, minimum length 12 inches.
- (ii) Release all salmon other than sockeye.
