### NEW SECTION

### WAC 220-312-04000R Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Puget Sound.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-312-040, it is unlawful to violate the following provisions, provided that unless otherwise amended, all permanent rules remain in effect; effective immediately through September 30, 2018:

Nisqually River (Thurston Co.):

(a) Salmon: Closed to fishing for or retaining on Sundays
