WAC 220-312-06000U Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Columbia River.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-312-060, it is unlawful to violate the following provisions, provided that unless otherwise amended, all permanent rules remain in effect. Effective August 18 until further notice:

- (a) From a true north and south line through Buoy 10 to Highway 395 Bridge in Pasco: closed to fishing at night for salmon and steelhead.
- (b) Priest Rapids Dam to Rock Island Dam:
 - (i) Salmon, immediately through August 31, 2018:
 - (A) Daily limit 6, no more than 3 sockeye may be retained.
 - (B) Release adult Chinook and coho.
 - (C) Salmon minimum length is 12 inches.
- (c) Rock Island Dam to Rocky Reach Dam:
 - (i) Salmon, immediately through October 15, 2018:
 - (A) Daily limit 6, no more than 3 sockeye may be retained.
 - (B) Release adult Chinook and coho.
 - (C) Salmon minimum length is 12 inches.
- (d) Rocky Reach Dam to Wells Dam:
 - (i) Salmon, immediately through October 15, 2018:
 - (A) Daily limit 6, no more than 2 adult Chinook and 3 sockeye may be retained.
 - (B) Release wild adult Chinook and coho.
 - (C) Salmon minimum length is 12 inches.
- (e) Wells Dam to Hwy. 173 Bridge at Brewster:
 - (i) Salmon, immediately through August 31, 2018:
 - (A) Daily limit 6, no more than 2 adult Chinook and 3 Sockeye may be retained.
 - (B) Release wild adult Chinook and coho.
 - (C) Salmon minimum length is 12 inches.
- (f) Hwy. 173 Bridge at Brewster to Chief Joseph Dam:
 - (i) Salmon, immediately through October 15, 2018:
 - (A) Daily limit 6, no more than 2 adult Chinook and 3 Sockeye may be retained.
 - (B) Release wild adult Chinook and coho.
 - (C) Salmon minimum length is 12 inches.

WAC 220-312-03000B Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Southwest.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-312-030, it is unlawful to violate the following provisions, provided that unless otherwise amended, all permanent rules remain in effect. Effective August 18 until further notice:

- (1) Drano Lake:
 - (a) Closed to fishing at night for salmon and steelhead.
 - (b) Release all steelhead.
- (2) Wind River from mouth to 400' below Shipherd Falls fish ladder:
 - (a) Closed to fishing at night for salmon and steelhead.
 - (b) Release all steelhead.
