NEW SECTION

WAC 220-312-04000Y Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Puget Sound.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-312-040, effective October 10, 2018:

- (a) Skagit River, from the mouth to a line projected across the thread of the river 200' upstream of the mouth of the Baker River:
- (i) Closed to all fishing the dates of October 10 and 11, 2018.
- (ii) Salmon: Daily limit 4, up to 2 wild coho may be retained. Release Chinook and chum.
- (b) Skagit River from a line projected across the thread of the river 200' upstream of the mouth of the Baker River to the Hwy. 530 Bridge in Rockport: Salmon: Daily limit 4, up to 2 wild coho may be retained. Release Chinook and chum.
