NEWSECTION

WAC 220-312-06000B Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Columbia River.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-312-060, effective October 16, 2018 until further notice it is unlawful to violate the following provisions, provided that unless otherwise amended, all permanent rules remain in effect:

- (a) Mouth of the Columbia River from Buoy 10 to the HWY 395 Bridge at Pasco: Salmon and steelhead, immediately until further notice: Closed.
- (b) HWY 395 Bridge at Pasco to the Old Hanford townsite powerline towers:
- (i) Salmon, effective immediately through October 31, 2018: Closed.
- (ii) Steelhead, immediately until further notice:
- (A) Daily limit 1 hatchery steelhead.
- (B) Release all steelhead other than those marked by both a clipped adipose fin and clipped right ventral fin with healed over scars.
