EMERGENCY RULE

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.

Reasons for this finding: This emergency rule is needed to increase the salmon daily limit from the Hwy. 530 Bridge to Cascade River Rd. on the Skagit River. After WDFW and co-managers upgraded the returning coho run to the Skagit River, daily coho limits were increased from the mouth to the Hwy. 530 Bridge in Rockport. The intent, however was to increase limits all the way to Cascade River Rd. This rule corrects the previous filing. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.

NEW SECTION

WAC 220-312-04000Z Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Puget Sound.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-312-040, effective immediately through December 31, 2018:

(a) Skagit River, from the mouth to a line projected across the thread of the river 200' upstream of the mouth of the Baker River:

(i) Closed to all fishing the dates of October 10 and 11, 2018.

(ii) Salmon: Daily limit 4, up to 2 wild coho may be retained. Release Chinook and chum.

(b) Skagit River from a line projected across the thread of the river 200' upstream of the mouth of the Baker River to Cascade River Rd. (Marblemount Bridge): Salmon: Daily limit 4, up to 2 wild coho may be retained. Release Chinook and chum.
