#### NEW SECTION

### WAC 220-312-04000A Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Puget Sound.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-312-040, effective immediately through December 31, 2018:

- (a) Skagit River, from the mouth to a line projected across the thread of the river 200' upstream of the mouth of the Baker River:
- (i) Closed to all fishing the dates of October 22 through 12:00 p.m. October 23, 2018.
- (ii) Salmon: Daily limit 4, up to 2 wild coho may be retained. Release Chinook and chum.
- (b) Skagit River from a line projected across the thread of the river 200' upstream of the mouth of the Baker River to Cascade River Rd. (Marblemount Bridge): Salmon: Daily limit 4, up to 2 wild coho may be retained. Release Chinook and chum.
