Reasons for this finding: During September all fisheries in Willapa Bay were constrained or closed in response to indicators which suggested that the Willapa Bay Fall Chinook return was significantly lower than preseason predictions. More recent information shows minimal Fall Chinook encounters are occurring in the commercial fishery and will further decrease as we approach the end of the return. In-season estimates for coho stock abundance are consistent with pre-season expectation and chum encounters are tracking near pre-season expectations. Therefore, with this emergency rule, commercial fisheries in Willapa Bay are being returned to pre-season openings in the adopted rules from North of Falcon, chinook retention remains closed. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.
