## WAC 220-312-03000J Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Southwest.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-312-030, effective December 6, 2018 until further notice:

**Drano Lake (Skamania Co.):** In the waters downstream of markers on point of land downstream and across from Little White Salmon National Fish Hatchery and upstream of the Highway 14 Bridge: Closed waters.
