WAC 220-313-06000V Puget Sound salmon—Saltwater seasons and daily limits. Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-313-060, the following rules apply effective January 1 through March 31, 2019:

Catch Record Card Area 10:

(a) January 1 through March 31:

(i) Daily limit of 1 salmon.

(ii) Release wild Chinook.

(b) Waters of Agate Pass west of a line from Point Monroe to Indianola and east of a line from Point Bolin to Battle Point: Fly fishing only, lead core lines prohibited, and catch and release from January 1 through January 31.
