**EMERGENCY RULE**

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.

**Reasons for this finding:** This emergency rule is needed to reduce the salmon daily limit in Catch Record Card Area 10. Based on abundance estimates there is not sufficient salmon available to maintain a fishery through the planned season. A daily limit of one salmon will increase the potential of the winter fishery to remain open for the entire winter season. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.

NEW SECTION

**WAC 220-313-06000V Puget Sound salmon—Saltwater seasons and daily limits.**  
Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-313-060, the following rules apply effective January 1 through March 31, 2019:

Catch Record Card Area 10:

- (a) January 1 through March 31:
  - (i) Daily limit of 1 salmon.
  - (ii) Release wild Chinook.
- (b) Waters of Agate Pass west of a line from Point Monroe to Indianola and east of a line from Point Bolin to Battle Point: Fly fishing only, lead core lines prohibited, and catch and release from January 1 through January 31.
