of the day Saturday, January 19. This closure is necessary to avoid exceeding the allowable limit of total encounters including							
both retained and released fish. The fishery is being closed to control impacts on stocks of concern and ensure compliance							
with conservation objectives. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.
