NEW SECTION

WAC 220-312-04000M Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Puget Sound.

Effective June 1 through July 15, 2020, the following provisions of WAC 220-312-040 regarding fishing seasons for all species on the Cascade River, shall be as described below. All other provisions of WAC 220-312-040 not addressed herein, or unless otherwise amended, remain in effect:

Cascade River (Skagit Co.) from the mouth to Rockport-Cascade Rd. Bridge:

Closed to all recreational fishing on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays of each week.
