**Reasons for this finding:** This emergency rule is needed to correct the previous filing of WSR 20-20-032, that inadvertently opened the portion of Marine Area 12 south of Ayock Point. This rule will close that area and is consistent with WDFW management plans and with how co-managers have structured their crab fisheries this year. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.

## NEW SECTION

### **WAC 220-330-04000Q Crab--Areas and Seasons—Personal use.**

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-330-040, effective immediately through December 31, 2020, Puget Sound recreational crab seasons are as listed below. All other provisions of WAC 220-330-040 not addressed herein remain in effect unless otherwise amended by emergency rule:

It is permissible to crab for personal use in the following Marine Areas: 4 East of the Bonilla-Tatoosh line, 5, 6, 7, 9, and 12 north of Ayock point.
