#### NEW SECTION

### WAC 220-312-04000G Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Puget Sound.

Effective July17 through August 31, 2021, the following provisions of WAC 220-312-040, regarding recreational salmon seasons fishing for Baker Lake, shall be as described below. All other provisions of WAC 220-312-040 not addressed herein, or unless otherwise amended by emergency rule, remain in effect:

Baker Lake (Whatcom Co.): Salmon:

- (a) Daily limit 2 sockeye only. Minimum size 18 inches.
- (b) Each angler aboard a vessel may deploy salmon angling gear until the daily salmon limit for all anglers aboard has been achieved.
