EMERGENCY RULE

Reasons for this finding: This rule returns coastal tributaries and the Hoko river to permanent rules, therefore implementing sport harvest opportunity for hatchery Spring Chinook as agreed to under the 2022 co-management Harvest Agreement for Spring and Summer Salmon Fisheries in the Quillayute River System.
