**WAC 220-313-06000V Puget Sound salmon—saltwater seasons and daily limits.**

Effective June 1, 2022, until further notice, the following provisions of WAC 220-313-060 regarding salmon seasons in Catch Record Card Area 11 shall be as described below. All other provisions of WAC 220-313-060 not addressed herein, or unless otherwise amended by emergency rule, remain in effect:

**Catch Record Card Area 11: Salmon:**

- (a) Daily limit 2, of which up to 1 may be a Chinook.
- (b) Release chum and wild Chinook.
