NEW SECTION

WAC 220-313-06000T Puget Sound salmon—saltwater seasons and daily limits.

Effective February 24 through March 31, 2022 the following provisions of WAC 220-313-060 regarding salmon seasons in Catch Record Card Area 10, except Seacrest Pier, Waterman Pier, Bremerton Boardwalk, and Illahee State Park Pier, shall be as described below. All other provisions of WAC 220-313-060 not addressed herein, or unless otherwise amended by emergency rule, remain in effect:

Catch Record Card Area 10 except Seacrest Pier, Waterman Pier, Bremerton Boardwalk, and Illahee State Park Pier: Salmon:

- (a) Open Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays, each week. Closed Sundays, Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays each week.
- (b) Daily limit 1.
- (c) Chinook, minimum size 22 inches. Other salmon species, no minimum size.
- (d) Release wild Chinook.

REPEALER
