NEW SECTION

WAC 220-340-12000I Commercial Razor clams.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-340-120, effective June 11 through July 5, 2022, a person may dig for and possess razor clams for commercial purposes only in those waters and detached beaches of Razor Clam Area 2 lying south of the Willapa Bay Ship Channel, west of Ellen Sands, and north of the tip of Leadbetter Point. Digging is prohibited on the west side of Leadbetter Point south of 46°39.765' N. Access to Razor Clam Area 2 is by boat only.

REPEALER

The following section of the Washington Administrative Code is repealed effective July 6, 2022:
