NEW SECTION

WAC 220-312-05000X Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Eastside.

Effective September 23, through October 31, 2022, the following provisions of WAC 220-312-050 regarding salmon seasons in the Yakima River shall be as described below. All other provisions of WAC 220-312-050 not addressed herein, or otherwise amended by emergency rule, remain in effect:

Yakima River (Benton County); from the Hwy. 240 bridge in Richland (river mile 2.1) upstream to Grant Avenue Bridge in Prosser (river mile 47.0), except year-round closure areas: Salmon:

- (a) Open September 23 through October 31, 2022:
- (b) Daily limit 2 adult salmon. No daily limit for jack salmon. Release all salmon other than Chinook and coho.
- (c) Barbless hooks required.
- (d) Night Closure in effect.
