Reasons for this finding: Final summer recreational harvest estimates indicate that sufficient quota remains in Marine Areas 10 and 11 to open recreational crab harvest beginning November 15. Marine Areas 4 East of the Bonilla-Tatoosh line, 5, 6, 7, 8-1, 8-2, 9, and 12 north of a line projected true east from Ayock Point have been open since October 1, 2022.						
Immediate adoption of this rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare. Observing time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.

WAC 220-330-04000H Crab--Areas and Seasons—Personal use.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-330-040, effective immediately through December 31, 2022, it is unlawful to fish for crab for personal use in Puget Sound in all waters of Marine Areas, 4 east of the Bonilla-Tatoosh line, 5, 6, 7, 8-1, 8-2, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13, except as provided herein:

Effective 12:01 a.m. November 15, through 11:59 p.m. December 31, 2022 it is permissible to crab for personal use in the following Marine Areas: 4 East of the Bonilla-Tatoosh line, 5, 6, 7, 8-1, 8-2, 9, 10, 11, and 12 north of a line projected true east from Ayock Point.
