WAC 220-412-090 Multi-season deer and elk tags

Chronic wasting disease (CWD)

- Caused by prions
- Highly transmissible, untreatable, and always fatal
- Can reduce freeranging cervid populations
- Affected animals can appear normal
- Diagnosis requires laboratory testing



Surveillance program

- Focused on eastern
 Washington
- Hunter submission is voluntary via check stations, appointment, dropoff, and mail-in
- Low sample sizes
 limit ability to detect
 the disease





Proposed CWD incentive program

- 100 free multi-season deer tags
- Hunters that submit samples are automatically entered
- Tag is good for the following license year
- No impact on current deer multi-season tag draw odds
- Paid for by sponsorship from Backcountry Hunters and Anglers and existing legislative funds

To be eligible, hunters must have submitted their deer or elk for CWD sampling to WDFW staff during the preceding license year.
