Reasons for this finding: This emergency rule is necessary to open salmon seasons in Catch Record Card Area 7. Catch							
estimates for the Marine Area 7 summer Chinook fishery indicate that through July 23rd, 2022, 67% of the harvest quota (1,203 of 1800), 25% of unmarked encounters (988 of 3,991) and 23% of sublegal encounters (593 of 2,573) have been							
reached. This allows space for additional days of fishing to be added to the 2022 summer Chinook season. There is							
insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.

NEW SECTION

WAC 220-313-06000Z Puget Sound salmon—saltwater seasons and daily limits.

Effective the day of July 21, 2023, only, for Catch Record Card Area 7, the following provisions of WAC 220-313-060 regarding salmon seasons shall be modified as described herein. All other provisions of WAC 220-313-060 not addressed herein, or unless otherwise amended by emergency rule, remain in effect:

Catch Record Card Area 7:

- (a) Daily limit 2 salmon, including no more than 1 hatchery Chinook. Release chum, wild Chinook and wild coho.
- (b) Waters of Rosario Strait and Eastern Strait of Juan de Fuca closure area described in WAC 220-313-020(7): Closed.
- (c) Waters of Bellingham Bay described in WAC 220-313-020(1): Closed.
- (d) Lummi Bay: Waters east of a line from Gooseberry Point to Sandy Point: Closed.
