Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:							
That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health,							
safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon							
adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.							
That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.							
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Reasons for this finding: This emergency rule is necessary to open salmon seasons in Catch Record Card Area 7. Catch estimates for the Marine Area 7 summer Chinook fishery indicate that through July 21, 2023, 78% of the harvest quota (1,696 of 2,181) has been reached, 23% of unmarked encounters (971 of 4,258) and 64% of sublegal encounters (1,618 of 2,554) have also been accounted for. Based on daily catch rates thus far, this allows space for two additional days of fishing to be added to the 2023 summer Chinook season. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.

NEW SECTION

WAC 220-313-06000B Puget Sound salmon—saltwater seasons and daily limits.

Effective July 28 through July 29, 2023, for Catch Record Card Area 7, the following provisions of WAC 220-313-060 regarding salmon seasons shall be modified as described herein. All other provisions of WAC 220-313-060 not addressed herein, or unless otherwise amended by emergency rule, remain in effect:

Catch Record Card Area 7:

- (a) Daily limit 2 salmon, including no more than 1 hatchery Chinook. Release chum, wild Chinook and wild coho.
- (b) Waters of Rosario Strait and Eastern Strait of Juan de Fuca closure area described in WAC 220-313-020(7): Closed.
- (c) Waters of Bellingham Bay described in WAC 220-313-020(1): Closed.
- (d) Lummi Bay: Waters east of a line from Gooseberry Point to Sandy Point: Closed.
